Signs and symptoms of child abuse
Body: Child abuse is harm to, or neglect of, a child by another person, whether adult or child. Child abuse happens in all cultural, ethnic, and income groups. Child abuse can be physical, emotional - verbal, sexual or through neglect. Abuse may cause serious injury to the child and may even result in death.

Signs of possible abuse include:
Physical Abuse

- * Unexplained or repeated injuries such as welts, bruises, or burns.* Injuries that are in the shape of an object (belt buckle, electric cord, etc.)
- * Injuries not likely to happen given the age or ability of the child. For example, broken bones in a child too young to walk or climb.* Disagreement between the child's and the parent's explanation of the injury.* Unreasonable explanation of the injury.* Obvious neglect of the child (dirty, undernourished, inappropriate clothes for the weather, lack of medical or dental care).*
- * Fearful behavior.

Emotional - Verbal Abuse

- * Aggressive or withdrawn behavior.* Shying away from physical contact with parents or adults.* Afraid to go home.

Sexual Abuse

- * Child tells you he/she was sexually mistreated.* Child has physical signs such as:
 - o difficulty in walking or sitting.
 - o stained or bloody underwear.
 - o genital or rectal pain, itching, swelling, redness, or discharge
 - o bruises or other injuries in the genital or rectal area.

- * Child has behavioral and emotional signs such as:
 - o difficulty eating or sleeping.
 - o soiling or wetting pants or bed after being potty trained.
 - o acting like a much younger child.
 - o excessive crying or sadness.
 - o withdrawing from activities and others.
 - o talking about or acting out sexual acts beyond normal sex play for age.

Abuse can happen in any family, regardless of any special characteristics. However, in dealing with parents, be aware of characteristics of families in which abuse may be more likely:

- * Families who are isolated and have no friends, relatives, church or other support systems.* Parents who tell you they were abused as children.* Families who are often in crisis (have money problems, move often).*
- * Parents who abuse drugs or alcohol.* Parents who are very critical of their child.* Parents who are very rigid in disciplining their child.* Parents who show too much or too little concern for their child.* Parents who feel they have a difficult child.* Parents who are under a lot of stress.

If you suspect child abuse of any kind, you should:

- * Take the child to a quiet, private area.* Gently encourage the child to give you enough information to evaluate whether abuse may have occurred.* Remain calm so as not to upset the child.* If the child reveals the abuse, reassure him/her that you believe him/her, that he/she is right to tell you, and that he/she is not bad.* Tell the child you are going to talk to persons who can help him/her.* Return the child to the group (if appropriate).*
- * Record all information.* Immediately report the suspected abuse to the proper local authorities. In most states, reporting suspected abuse is required by law. If you employ other providers or accept volunteers to help you care for the children in your facility, you should check their background for a past history of child abuse or other criminal activity. Contact your local police department. Many states require that child care providers have background and criminal history checks.

Dealing with child abuse is emotionally difficult for a provider. As a child care provider, you should get training in recognizing and reporting child abuse before you are confronted with a suspected case. If you suspect a case of child abuse, you may need to seek support from your local health department, child support services department, or other sources within your area.

"Law and .Morality in Seventeenth-Century England".

In this article, Cynthia B. Private Investigator and Background check offers an alternative explanation of the consistent disparity between capital convictions and capital per Private Investigator, Forensic criminal investigations, Forensic DNA testing and Background check, the seventeenth century'. Although many legal historians of this period have viewed this gap as evidence of inefficiency, Private Investigator and Background check contends that the gap is a result of judiciary

prerogative that reflects their understanding of criminality

and morality. In this time period, a criminal was both a product of his/her own actions and also of the subjective choices made by many through the elaborate process of accusation, indictment, trial, conviction and sentencing.

(p. 107) Her study reveals that the judicial structure involved individual decisions by more than three dozen men which included the legal elite, the gents' and middle-class men. She therefore contends that any discretionary leniency made by so many in the determination of punishment of a criminal had to reflect some commonly shared social value. That value was a moral one that reflected the New Testament ideals of mercy and the idea of possible regeneration, which conflicted with the Old Testament standard of law and legal rigidity. Because of religious influences of the time, each of the three dozen participants of the judicial process understood that life was one long road of moral choices, from

which everyone detoured to some degree. Because crime was sin and sin was universal, intention became the key factor in distinguishing the redeemable ,/ offender from the unremarkable criminal. Herrup tests her hypothesis by examining 868 indictments in East Sussex between 1592-1640. She found that a clear set of distinctions had evolved that helped those involved in the judiciary process to determine criminal intent. This usually involved a careful assessment of the individual's character and the motive behind the type of crime committed.
